1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Nilambazar College is situated at Bidyanagar adjoining the National Highway No – 8 on the southern outskirts of Nilambazar, Karimganj, Assam. The College was established in the year 1994 with a view to impart higher education to the poverty stricken and backward students of greater south Karimganj area. Initially classes of the college were started at S.V.Vidyaniketan H.S. School, Nilambazar in the morning shift. Then the college shifted in its own land in the year 1998. At present the college has grown into a full-fledged higher educational institution with its own campus and adequate infrastructure to accommodate more than 1000 students' undergraduate level in Arts stream only. It is a co-educational institution affiliated to Assam University, Silchar.

Since its inception, the college has been dedicatedly rendering service in imparting quality higher education to students. Due to the active involvement in disseminating knowledge, Assam University extended permanent affiliation in the year 2012 for the ongoing Arts Course. The college has obtained Final concurrence from the Government of Assam in 2004 and also 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956 on 11th January 2013. Then the college was provincialised on 14th August 2013 by the Govt. of Assam. Moreover, the college was located just a few kilometres apart from the border of India-Bangladesh.

Nilambazar College has maintained a substantially good academic record till date. The college aims at enabling the students to inculcate values through the existing curriculum. The college has been reputed and socially responsible institution in different areas like- academic, sports and cultural fields. The College Governing Body is consisted of well educated and morally responsible persons who are solely dedicated to the cause of social welfare and promoting quality education. The college is marching forward in the right direction under the collective wisdom of learned and able management.

A good number of students churned out by this college are contributing valuably for the growth of the society. Many Students are also involved with various activities in the field of art, culture and sports. The institution is actively and continually engaged with academic and socio – cultural activities.

- To increase the number of books, journals, etc. in the library.

- There is scope for further utilization of campus space.

Institutional Challenge

- As college is situated in a rural area, good students prefer to go to the bigger and more renowned colleges in the city in search of better opportunity and glamour.
- Rural Colleges like us, struggling to be completely prepared for NEP 2020 and need support from higher authority.
- Difficult to arrange awareness programme frequently, amidst busy schedule of daily class routine and examinations in the semester system.
- Process of industrial collaboration is a major challenge for the college due to the lack of nearby industry.
- Nilambazar College is lacking a serious scarcity in fund for its infrastructural development.
- We are facing challenge to explore the research potential of our existing resources.
- Socio-economic backward condition of students.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Nilambazar College is permanently affiliated to Assam University, Silchar and so the College follows the CBCS curriculum designed and developed by the affiliating university in accordance with UGC guidelines. The college ensures the effective implementation and timely completion of the curriculum in a planned manner. The Academic calendar and class routine are prepared at the beginning of each academic year. Every department prepares departmental class routine, action plan, strategies and conducts continuous internal evaluation for effective implementation of the syllabus.

The college uses certain tools for effective curriculum delivery which includes regular maintenance of Teachers Diary, HOD diary, student attendance registers and mentor-mentee programme. Moreover, the college offers tutorial/remedial classes to weak students. The students are also engaged in a number of activities like various Add on Courses, Departmental Wall Magazine, Departmental Seminars/ workshops, field trips, project works, internships, assignments on various topics etc.

The institution integrates the various cross cutting issues into the curriculum by conducting awareness programmes to enrich the human and social values of the students. The college takes regular feedback on the academic performance from its stakeholders and necessary analysis of the feedback and follow up action for the better implementation of the curriculum.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The college pays serious attention to improve the quality of the teaching – learning process. The college always focuses on holistic academic, collective, emotional and aesthetic progress of the students. Announcement for Admission, fee structures etc. are made in the college notice- board and college website declaring all the relevant dates and all other information regarding admission process. It is a co-education institution and equity is fairly maintained in admission irrespective of caste, creed, sex and religion. About 55 to 60 percent of the reserve seats were filled during the last five years and almost 70% of the total number enrolled students of the college are from below poverty line. Provisions are also made for differently able students to have easy access to class rooms. Students are also supported through a well designed mentor system as displayed on college website. The evaluation system of the internal examination is elaborated upon in the classes to ensure effective execution of the internal assessment. Students are assessed on a continuous basis through innovative and reformed techniques such as group discussion, assignments, project work etc. which helps to identify the advanced learners and slow learners based on their performances. Accordingly remedial classes and other techniques are used to support learners with different abilities and pace.

The college has its own website www.nilambazarcollge.ac.in which displayed numerous information relating to college. College provides skill enhancement programmes like Yoga, Meditation etc. College organizes various Awareness programmes for community and students. The college has also a Registered Alumni Association Since 2022.

At present total enrollment of the college is 1041 and the faculty strength is 27 (24 permanent and 03 temporary). Student –Teacher ratio is 38.5. Average pass percentage of final year students are better than that of the University results during the last five years. The faculty, students and parents are well aware about the PO and CO. Attainment of PO and CO is made possible by internal assessment, end semester results, students' seminar, class room interaction etc. Parent-teachers meetings are also held from time to time to inform the parents about students' performances.

Research, Innovations and Extension

To shape and enhance the growth of intellectual, Research, Innovations and Extension activities, Nilambazar College constituted a Research and Development Cell to enhance and ensure all possible help to the researchers to promote research works and Environment within the College. Though the college has a minimum infrastructure facilities to carry out research works, internet and reference books are made available to all faculty members to facilitate research works. Faculty members are always encouraged to pursue research work/project. A good number of faculty members have been awarded Ph.D degree by the affiliating University in the recent past. Some are at present pursuing Ph.D research work. Faculty members have presented/published a good number of research papers in various national and international seminars/journals/books. Apart from that the academic departments of the college has organised a few numbers of seminars/workshops during the last five year as a part of extension of knowledge.

The institute has created innovative eco-system for creation and transfer of knowledge. College is introducing vermicomposting unit and has also agro based fishery project within the college campus.

The college has several committees/cell such as NSS, NCC, Women's Cell, Cultural Committee, Alumni Association etc. which organise numerous awareness programme, social service activities in the nearby villages for encouraging the students and developing social responsibilities in them.

The college has also involves in extension activities in different categories like community developments through adopting villages, Health Awareness, Health Camp, Blood Donation Camp, Environmental Awareness, Gender Sensitisation, etc. The NSS and NCC Unit organise extensions and awareness programmes such as health care, hygiene, education, cleaning, Tree plantation, other social work in adopted village and also both inside and outside of the college.

The college celebrates various days of local, national and international importance like Independence Day, Republic Day, National Education Day, International Women's Day and International Yoga Day etc.

The college has a number of functional MOU/collaborations/linkages with other institutions for faculty exchange, students exchange, internship, field trip and on-the job training. MOU signed will also help in better implementation of the multidisciplinary approach of the NEP 2020.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The College has been making full efforts for the development of infrastructure of the college. The campus of the college consists of both RCC and Assam type Pucca buildings. There are adequate class rooms, office rooms, principal chamber, Teacher's common room, Library Room, separate office for NCC & NSS, distance education centre, IQAC Room, well furnished Computer Lab, canteen and waiting shed. The college has Pure drinking water facility, 30 KVA High power Generator and a 63 KVA Electricity transformer.

The students are facilitated with Boys Common Room, Girls Common Room, separate toilets for boys and girls, both Cycle/Bike and Car parking stands. The college provides facilities for various outdoor and indoor games. Students are encouraged to take part in various cultural activities like college social week, Independence Day, Republic Day, Quiz, Debate, Essay Writing Competition etc.

The college has provided 2 class rooms with ICT enable facility and Wi-Fi facility for internet browsing. The college has broadband internet connection. There is a campus Development Committee to look after the whole affairs of the campus including beautification, sanitation and cleanliness etc.

The college library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) by KOHA software and has total number of 4519 books, 02 e-Journals, 08 journals, 10 magazines and 4 newspapers and e-resources through N-List available. The library reading room is spacious enabled with computers and photocopier machine.

The college provides a disabled friendly and barrier-free infrastructure in the campus.

There are committees like construction committee and purchase committee to make decisions at the implementation level. A designated C.A. firm has been assigned the responsibility to conduct the annual auditing.

Student Support and Progression

The college is committed towards students' progression and extends all support for their development. The college offers more than 75% of admission fee waivers to economically underprivileged students, as per the direction of the state Government. The students of the college are also benefitted by various scholarships provided by the state/central government as well as by UGC. During last five years the total number of 3318 students got benefitted by various scholarships and free ships.

Various capacity building and skill enhancement activities and awareness programme on face to face counseling, soft skill development, health and hygiene, yoga and physical fitness, computing skills, language and communication skills are also organized by the college to develop the skills and awareness among the students.

The college has valid units for students like NSS, NCC etc. The college provides tutorial classes for the weaker students in order to bring improvement in their academic performance. The college also provides prestigious medals and certificates to the rank holders securing highest marks in the final examinations.

The students Welfare Cell, Career Counseling and placement cell etc are some of the initiatives taken up by the institution to benefit its students to become contributory members of society.

The college has framed Grievance Redressal Policy and various committees namely, Anti-ragging cell, Grievance redressal committee, anti-sexual harassment committee, women cell is in place to address the grievances of students. Although the cases of ragging have never been reported, grievances related to examinations and academic activities related are addressed by the grievance redressal committee.

During the assessment period a total of 566 students have completed their graduation out of 820 students from this college and amongst them 59 students have progressed to higher education and 65 students have been placed /employed in different Government /Non Government sectors. There is also a registered Alumni Association in the college which is also actively participating in the development of the college by involving themselves in various activities and contributions.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The college has its own vision, mission and objectives. The Governing Body of the college is acting as the sole decision making authority with the principal as its secretary. The management of Nilambazar College is highly decentralized and democratic in its approach. Various Committees have been constituted to conduct different activities with a view to make effective implementation. Academic committee takes care of the academic activities of the college. The institution follows all the rules and guidelines of affiliating university, UGC and State Government for employment, admission, utilization of funds, maintaining disciplines and overall management.

The college implements e-governance in areas of administration, financial accounts, student admission and support and also examination. The college has also adopted certain welfare measures and transparent mechanism for performance appraisal of the teaching and non-teaching staff. Faculty members have been encouraged to attend Faculty Development Programmes (FDP), Faculty Induction Programmes (FIP), participate in seminars, workshops, refresher course and other training programmes for the professional

development of the staff.

The financial management is assisted by DDO and the accountant of the college. However, yearly financial audits are conducted externally by a registered chartered accountant.

The IQAC of the college functions as a key commander in monitoring multifarious activities and co-ordinating the diverse stakeholders. The IQAC reviews different aspects and initiates the work for quality enhancement in the college by organizing programme for both the faculties and the students. The IQAC holds regular meetings, collects feedbacks, analysis and takes necessary measures for improvement in various sectors. The IQAC also signed up Memorandum of Understanding (MOUs) with other establishments for the welfare of the institution. Recently the College is assessed by Royal Assessments Private Limited (RAPL) and found to comply with the requirements of Quality Management Systems, ISO 9001: 2015.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The college has taken bold initiatives for the promotion of Gender Equity among the students at the institution by providing equal opportunity for both the genders providing separate boys and girls common room, providing student union with proportionate share basis. Further the college encourages both the gender to take part in various programmes like women empowerment, physical trainings, self defense and other security measures by installing CC Cameras, fire extinguisher etc.

The college has adopted various measures and drives to keep the campus clean and green. Alternative energy sources have been introduced. Solid Waste Management introduced in the college through vermicompost unit. Incinerator, Sanitary Napkins, Vendor Machine has been installed to maintain cleanliness and hygienic environment.

The college has done its Environment/ Green Audit, Energy Audits, Gender Audit, Academic & Administrative Audit for its best future prospects and development. To provide facilities towards the Divyangjan student's ramps, disabled friendly toilets, wheel chairs, supporting sticks have been made available in the campus.

The college has conducted regular programmes, academic and extracurricular activities to create and foster an atmosphere of tolerance, communal and cultural harmony and social integrity. All the stakeholders take part in state and national election, observes National Voters Day, National Constitution Day on a regular mode. All the members obey rules and regulation of the college and always maintain the guidelines and code of conduct of the college.

To promote sensitivity and awareness among the students and side by side to decentralize power and function of various activity of the college, the college authority has implemented two best practices such as "National Service Scheme" (NSS) and "Decentralization of Responsibilities" programme introduced by the college authority as best practice. The college also initiated various positive and Distinctiveness measures for fostering good relationship with the neighborhood communities for the improvement and upliftment of the society and common masses.

Nilambazar College is an affiliated college under Assam University, Silchar and the college strictly follows course and curriculum prescribed by the affiliating University. However, considering the immense significance of multidisciplinary study in Higher Education, the college adheres to CBCS curriculum which is introduced by its affiliating university. The curriculum focuses on multidisciplinary subject which benefits the students having important and widely applicable effects. The Environmental studies is included in the curriculum as compulsory subject</p>
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	<p>which enables the students in encompasses a wide range of topics such as Bio-logical, cultural and Physical. Special emphasis will be given on socially and economically disadvantaged groups which include, gender, socio-cultural, and geographical identities and disabilities. The college also signed MOU with 3 (three) Colleges and other organizations to avail multidisciplinary courses. Nilambazar College is ready to adopt NEP 2020 in multidisciplinary programmes and Interdisciplinary courses as soon as our affiliating university gives us the opportunity.</p>

Academic bank of credits (ABC):</p>	<p>The preparedness of the institution in implementation of Academic Bank of Credits depends upon the guidelines of the affiliating University and Higher Education Department, Govt. of Assam. For this purpose, a centralized database along with the database of the college is to be established to digitally store the academic credits carved by the student from various courses so that the credit earned by student previously could be forwarded when the student enters into the program again. However, the introduction of CBCS in the curriculum by the Assam University enables students' mobility across higher education system. For monitoring ABC, proper technical support system will be created.</p>

Skill development:</p>	<p>The Parents University of the college has introduced CBCS system in 2018 and it offers the skill enhancement courses (SEC) in the curriculum for Under Graduate Level in third, fourth, fifth & sixth semesters. The college has also plan to introduce more skill oriented and job oriented courses and made skill subjects compulsory for the students who are free to select skill courses of any department. Moreover, our college is ready to adopt and offer various Skill Development programmes that will be offered in the New Syllabus for NEP 2020.</p>

1.1.1

The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Response:

Nilambazar College was established in 1994 is an affiliated institution under Assam University and the college follows the syllabus and academic guidance as prescribed by the university time to time. At the beginning of every academic session, the college prepares the academic calendar for the effective implementation of the curriculum framed by the university in consultation with faculty members. The entire syllabus of a particular semester is divided among the teachers in the number of classes/hours. The tutorial and remedial classes are conducted on a need based basis, while class tests and internal examinations are also conducted at a regular interval in order to assess the performance of the students as per the university guidelines. These results are reviewed and accordingly decisions are taken by the concerned department for the betterment of their students. However, teachers take their best effort to ensure quality development and to enhance academic growth of the students.

The teaching plan consists of detailed distribution of the syllabus among all the faculties of a particular department on the basis of the departmental meetings. Faculty members take utmost care to complete the syllabus in time. Tutorials, class tests and internal assessments comprise the formal evaluative processes, even students are encouraged to meet teachers beyond class hours for doubt clearing and any other curricular discussions. However, to overcome any sorts of inadequacy, the students are encouraged to make use of the library facility. To supplement their knowledge on curriculum and beyond, guest lectures by eminent scholars are also organized, visit to various historical places, educational tours and excursions and even project further to develop their practical knowledge.

To make the delivery of curriculum successful, the faculty members regularly update their knowledge by participating in Faculty Development Programme (FDP), Faculty Induction Programme (FIP), Refresher Courses (RC), various short term courses, workshops, seminars/webinars conducted by the affiliating colleges and various universities in India. In addition to that, many of them are also members of various committees of Assam University contributing their skillness and expertise in review of curriculum, continuous assessment and evaluation system, setting of question papers, sharing thoughts, views and ideas by attending various University level meetings.

In order to support the goal of effective curriculum delivery, mentor-mentee programme is also adopted where small groups are formed for academic and personal guidance. NCC and NSS Units have been striving continuously to meet the curricular aspect effectively with active cooperation of IQAC.

The examination pattern is strictly followed by the college as per the existing guidelines of Assam University. However, the transparency in the examination is also maintained at its best i.e. by conducting the examinations Under CCTV facilitated rooms by deputing the invigilators of different subjects other

than the same subject, by allowing the students to sit in a hall where sufficient distance is maintained as per the UGC norms and above all the entire examination is looked after strictly by the internally appointed AOC's by the college and under the university appointed external Supervisory Officer.

Response:

Curriculum enrichment is absolutely vital and a dynamic process in any educational system. The successful enrichment program enhances students life at college requires motivation and retention. Keeping these objectives in mind and considering about the various cross cutting issues, the university has already introduced subjects on environmental studies and ethics (philosophy) to impart value based education among the students of UG curriculum. Gender Sensitivity:- The general atmosphere of our college with equal opportunity to girls and boys in many courses provide an enabling environment for gender equality. Gender equality is promoted through lectures on women rights, lecture on women empowerment, gender based violations and other such related activities.

Human Values:- Papers containing units on value education are included in general courses of education department in all semesters, department of political science has papers on human rights both in general and major courses in all semesters as part of their course curriculum.

Environment and Sustainability: - Environmental education is also offered for the students to educate them about the relationship between man and environment, ecological and psychological perspective for sustainable development. For this Assam University includes Environmental Science as a compulsory subject for a UG curriculum. There are specific committees that make collective efforts to sensitize the students on respective areas to beautify the campus.

Anti Ragging Committee:-The college has formed this committee to protect new students from the harmful activities of the seniors. The committee is empowered to take severe actions against such elements. However no such incidence has been reported so far in the college.

Women Cell:- The college has also formed a women cell to address the gender specific issues and to take care of female students rights and safety.

Community Orientation:- NSS Unit of the college takes students to the community to be aware of the problems faced by the various sections of the society. NCC Cadets are provided training for team work and responsible living. During the last five years the NCC and NSS units carried out several training programmes for students and social activities like tree plantation, Swaccha Bharat Abhiyan, Drug Abuse Awareness campaign, Blood Donation camp, Free Health Check up etc.

Cultivating moral and ethical values among students is the need of the hour. The college organizes various awareness programmes to increase the ethical and moral values among students.

3. Plantation drives are intended to aware students about the burning issue of climate change.

Participatory Learning:

1. Field visits and Excursion Tours to historically and culturally important place within and outside the state are conducted to enhance the life skills and knowledge of the students.

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

Nilambazar College is an affiliated college of Assam University follows the University rules and regulations regarding internal/external assessment. The college has an academic calendar and it plans accordingly for the entire academic session.

Internal Assessment consist of two parts viz (i) Unit Test of 20 marks & (ii) Attendance of 10 marks. Usually, two unit tests are held in every semester. The examination cell of the college conducts all internal and external examination in the college. Internal Examination is compulsory for the students and marks obtained in the internal test are added to the final examination marks. Absentee students having genuine reasons may inform the authority with convincing documents is given chances to re-appear in their concerned re-examinations.

The college organises orientation programmes for the newly admitted students to make them

acquainted with the examination systems. Examination cell conducts all the examination as per the general timeline of Assam University with prior notice and information to the students. These notices are displayed in the departmental and college notice boards, principal's official WhatsApp Group and College Website.

Questions are set generally from the portions that have already been covered and discussed in the classes with options. Results of internal examination are duly intimated to the students. Teachers can assess the students and guide them accordingly to their interests and capabilities for continuous improvement in teaching – learning and evaluation process.

All the departments submit the mark sheets of internal assessment to the examination in-charges, for submitting the same to the affiliated university.

The IQAC of the college regularly monitors the mechanism of internal assessment.

There is proper provision for redresses of grievances of the students, their queries and problems concerned with the examination are solved at department level, college level & university level.

Department Level

If a student is dissatisfied with the evaluation process, he/she may raise grievance to the concerned Head of the department and it may be resolved at the departmental level, otherwise it may be raised to the examination cell.

College Level

College has also a common online / offline grievance form in our college website and in GRC. The grievance redressal cell (GRC) functions as Mechanism to meet up the grievances of the students. The cell maintains a Complaint Box in the college campus for the same. Student can write their complains on any issue, including internal assessment and drop it to the complaint box. The Box is checked time to time and actions are taken to redress their grievances.

University Level

Assam University has a common online grievance form for students to raise issues regarding external examinations.

The students have the facility of revaluation of their answer scripts if they are dissatisfied with their results. The students can also apply through RTI and demand a photo copy of their answer scripts.

The college adopts different mechanism and practices to communicate the course outcome to all the stakeholders of the college. The main objectives of such mechanism and practices are to provide the students and the teachers a clear and comprehensive idea of the concerned course in connection with the teaching learning process and to formulate measures for rectification if necessary. The main features of POs and COs of every department are displayed in college website.

The affiliating university prepares the syllabi for all programmes of the undergraduate level. Such type of assessment of the students is done on the basis of marks secured in the respective internal examinations of the college.
3. The students are assigned home assignment on particular topics to measure their knowledge, understanding and skills.
4. The departments organize departmental seminars, group discussions, quizzes, debates etc. to assess the programme outcome and course outcome.
5. Feedback taken from the students, parents/guardians, alumni on syllabus and the teachers is one of the significant methods of assessing the teaching-learning and evaluation system of the college.
6. Parent-Teacher Meets are organised regularly by the college and also by the academic department individually to review the teaching-learning and evaluation process.
7. The college has a career counselling cell to resolve various academic problems to help attain programme outcomes and to offer proper guidance to the students on various career options.
8. Staff meetings at department level are regularly held to review the progress of the students and to ensure the timely completion of the syllabus so that a clear way is paved towards optimum learning outcomes.
9. Records of students' progression also serve to measure the attainment of programme outcome in the college.

The whole teaching-learning process in the college can also be assessed on the Annual Alumni Day of the College. The gathering includes alumni who are being able to establish themselves in various walks of the society as college teacher or school teachers, to the Defence Sector or to the official Sector, in private company etc. Some of the Alumni members are in active politics and some others passionately involved in social services.

These are the examples of students transforming learning into practical way of life, finding the best way possible with one's individual capacity and making a livelihood out of it turning into socially responsible citizens, justifying the proper outcome of teaching-learning.

Nilambazar College has one large two storey building, one Assam type building and another single storey building that accommodate the administrative office and the academic departments, lecture halls, central library, girl's common room with toilet, boys common room, ICT room, seminar hall, NCC, NSS, Distance Education Centre (KKHSOU) office room, staff room with a well sophisticated wash room, facilities for sports and culture etc.

To ensure adequate availability of physical infrastructure the requirements of all Heads of Department and conveners of various cells are represented to the Principal during the meetings of HODs, and general staff meetings and through IQAC for the forth coming year well ahead of the preparation of the budgets for the next academic year. The **Academic Committee** plans ahead for all requirements regarding class rooms, furniture and other equipments. This ensures the management has sufficient time to acquire and replace some of the out dated facilities at the beginning of every academic year. Response:

Nilambazar College is a co-educational institution and it is governed by the governing body (GB) of the college which is formed by the department of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam. GB is the apex body of the college and executes the developmental activities of the college. The plans and policies are framed by GB, where local MLA acts as a special invitee, by involving various stakeholders and are in line with vision and mission of the college. GB, IQAC and faculty members play a pivotal role in designing and implementing quality policies in teaching-learning, research, governance and extension activities. There are formal and informal arrangements to coordinate the academic and administrative training and implementations which reflect the efforts of the college in realizing its vision. The involvement of the leadership is clearly visible in ensuring the execution of the action plans for the fulfillment of the mission.

Nilambazar College Governing Body is quite sensitive in various institutional practices such as NEP implementation; sustain institution growth, decentralization, participative management etc. That is why it has adopted the policy of decentralization and the same is ensured through participatory management of the institution. Response:

Nilambazar college is affiliated to Assam University and is provincialized under Department of Higher Education (DHE), Government of Assam. The Governing Body (GB) of the college is the highest decision making body of the college and is constituted as per guideline of the Department of Higher Education, Govt of Assam. Principal of the college is the Secretary of the G.B. The academic affairs are controlled by the affiliating university i.e. Assam University.

The college follows policy of participatory decision making which is evident from its administrative set up, appointment procedure, service rule etc.

Policies:

To realize the vision and mission, the college has framed various Academic and administrative policies for the upliftment of the institution.

Administrative Setup:

- Principal of the college is at the apex of the administration of the college and functions under the GB of the college.
- Academic In charge of the college works under Principal and mainly looks after the academic activities of the college.
- Head of the departments are responsible for looking after the individual departments and work in proximity with Academic In-charge. HODs are also member of the Academic Committee which

is the highest academic body of the college.

- Faculties are responsible for dissemination of knowledge & skill to the students. They are also members of various committees and take part actively in various decision making processes. Every year two faculty members are elected as representatives to the GB.
- Assistant Librarian is the in-charge of the central library who works under the Principal and is supported by Library Assistant and Library Bearer.
- IQAC of the college is responsible for ensuring quality in all academic and administrative activities.
- The non-teaching staffs of the college works under Principal with Senior Assistant at the helm of the affairs who is supported by Junior Assistant, Office Bearer and other 4th grade staff. Every year one office staff is elected as representative to the GB.

Procedure for Appointment:

The GB is the appointing authority of the college. It follows the rules and guidelines framed by UGC and State Government for appointment of both teaching and non-teaching staff. Proper advertisement and interview are conducted as per guidelines and a selection board is formed which maintains fair and transparent mechanism in the process.

Service Rule:

College follows the service rules and conditions laid down by the Department of Higher Education, Govt of Assam.

Procedure for Promotion :

All promotions are made as per the rules and regulations of DHE, Govt of Assam as per the guidelines of UGC regarding Career Advancement Scheme (CAS). The IQAC of the college organises Orientation programme to aware the faculty members about the API regulations issued time to time.

College prepared a perspective/strategic plan for its all-round development which was approved by the G.B of college. There are many focused areas in the perspective plan on curriculum development and deployment, teaching-learning process, infrastructure development, governance, progression of students, etc which are effectively deployed for qualitative improvement of the college.

Performance Appraisal System :

The performance appraisal system for the teaching staff is as per the guidelines and rules of UGC and Higher Education, Govt. of Assam. All UGC qualified teachers fill up a comprehensive Appraisal Performance Indicator (API) format year wise which is submitted to IQAC for ready reference to CAS promotion process. At the time of promotion the Appraisal Performance Indicator (API) format is scrutinized by Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC), headed by principal and then recommended by the G.B. for submission to the Director of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam through the principal. Moreover, Non-teaching staffs are promoted by the principal of the college according to their experience, subject to approval by Director of Higher Education, Assam.

The college is committed for the welfare of its staff and various measures are taken in this direction as per the provision of the existing government rule or as an initiative from the college.

- All employees working against permanent post are availing the New Pension Scheme, Gratuity and leave enhancement facility from Govt. of Assam at the time of superannuation.
- All staff working against permanent post are insured through Group Insurance Scheme as per

provision of Govt. of Assam.

- Employees provident fund facility is also available in the college.
- All permanent employees are allowed to draw medical allowances as per State Govt. Guidelines.
- Maternity and Child Care Leave is granted to the women employees of the institute.
- The staff of the college are entitled for Study Leave, Duty Leave, Paternity Leave, etc. as per Govt. rules.
- Non sanctioned full time employees of the college are granted special leave in case of death of their parents/spouse.
- Although there is no relief fund in the college, there are number of instances in recent years in which the college staff came out together and extended their helping hands to staffs facing health related problems through financial support under the leadership of the Principal.
- The special Casual leave is granted on critical medical emergencies.
- Frequent Health check-up is done in the campus.
- Covid-19 vaccination programme was done in the campus.
- Parking facility is provided for the staff members inside the campus.
- All the permanent employees of the college can avail Personal loan and House building loans as per the Bank rules.
- Canteen facilities are offered to the Employees at subsidized price.
- Library facility is provided to all staff members where they access to study materials.
- There is arrangement of safe Drinking Water for all employees.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources.

Nilambazar College maintains & follows a well-planned process for the mobilization of funds and resource. The process involves various committees of the institute as well as the Department Heads and Accounts section. Institute has designed some specific rules for the fund usage and resource utilization.

- Mobilization of Funds, the students fees are the major source of income of the college.
- Various government and non-government agencies sponsor events like seminars, legal awareness, & felicitation programmes.
- Contribution of the various materials from the Alumni Association of the College.
- Funds received from individuals.
- Salary grants received mainly from the State Govt.

Utilization of Funds

- The purchase committee seeks quotations from vendors for the purchase of equipment, computers, materials books, etc.
- The quotations are scrutinized by the purchase committee before a final decision is made based on parameters like pricing, quality, terms of service, etc.
- College budget & planning committee monitors the funds raised from the various heads.
- The college authority initiates all the development works provided by the Govt.

Resource Mobilization Policy and Procedure

- Before the financial year begins, college budget and planning committee prepare the college budget.
- The college budget includes recurring expenses such as salary, electricity and internet charges, stationary & other maintenance costs.
- It includes planned expenses such as furniture and other development Expenses.
- The budget is scrutinized and approved by the G.B.
- Accounts section and Purchase Committee monitor whether expenses are exceeding budget provision.
- The grants received by the college are also audited by chartered accountant.
- The routine committee looks after the proper utilization of class rooms.
- The library development committee takes care that the resources in the library are utilized optimally.
- Campus cleanness, plantation and its utilization is monitored by the college plantation & beautification committee.
- To ensure the optimum utilization of resources, the Principal issues directions from time to time.

The college conducts internal and external financial audit regularly. There is a two tier financial audit system in the college which involves –

1. Internal Audit by Chartered Accountant (CA)

It is conducted by a local chartered accounting firm appointed by Governing Body of the college.

2. External Audit by Government Audit

It is conducted by Department of Local Audit, Govt. of Assam.

The internal Audit is a continuous process which is carried out by CA. All bills, Vouchers and stock registers are checked and verified by the auditors. Finally, an audit report is prepared by the CA, which is placed before the G.B. for discussion and approval. The college authority has completed internal audit upto 2021-22.

The External audit is to be done by Department of Local Audit, Govt. of Assam, as per their schedule, assessment of Income – Expenditure and Receipt - Payment is checked following the government rule. The college has already taken necessary steps in this regard.

The institution reviews its teaching learning process, structures and methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals. For improving attendance and results of the students various initiatives are taken on the advice of IQAC. The major initiatives taken in this direction are :

1. Introduction of Feedback Process: The IQAC at Nilambazar College has applied a feedback system for all stakeholders based on institutional parameters such as infrastructure facilities, curriculum, delivery system, academic atmosphere, staff support and so on. The collected feedback are analyzed and actions are taken for improvement and redresses. It works as the technique for improvement of teaching – learning processes, progress in infrastructure facilities, professional upliftment of the faculty as well as office staff, ability and aptitude enhancement of students.

2. Best Department Award: IQAC of the college has initiated best department award from the session 2017-2018 on the basis of academic as well as co-curricular activities to enhance the work culture and to encourage and inspire the students as well as faculty members. The Best Department award consists of certificates along with mementoes and other gift items.

3. Attendance Monitoring: The IQAC of the college monitors the attendance of both the teachers as well as the students. The teacher's attendance is done digitally by Bio-metric machine and the student's attendance is done by maintaining attendance register of each department.

4. IQAC collects departmental academic plans at the beginning of every academic year and monitors its sound implementation throughout the year.

5. IQAC conveys its policies in respects of remedial teaching and mentoring to all the departments.

6. IQAC monitors internal marking in every department and ensures proper holding of internal examinations. It develops a mechanism as per the rule of the university for proper evaluation and uploading the marks in the given portal.

Nilambazar College is a co-educational institution with about 47.2% female students. The institution maintains its highest priority in providing safety and security related to academic environment to the students. Safety and security for the girls students is given the highest priority as the institution is co-educational. The institution commits to maintain zero tolerance policy against gender discrimination, ragging and sexual harassments. To promote the Gender Equity and Women Empowerment an audit for gender equity has been done to assess the equality measure of an institution. To ensure the gender equity the college has formed various cell and committees to ensure and monitor gender equity among students and staff.

1. Safety and Security:

- **CCTV Surveillance:** The college has 44 CCTV cameras which are functional for 24x7 mode.
- **Strong Boundary Wall:** The college campus is protected with strong boundary walls to protect the unauthorized entry inside the college campus.
- **ID Card:** To wear ID card issued by the college authority is mandatory for the students to enter in the college campus.
- **Women's Cell: Grievance Redressal Cell:** The college has constituted the cell to meet various grievance and complains of the students to ensure discipline in the college campus. There are complaint /suggestion boxes and grievance boxes placed around the college campus to lodge the complains easily by the students.
- **Anti Ragging Committee:** There is a strong anti ragging committee in the college to ensure the ill instances of ragging and zero ragging free campus. The committee includes faculties, guardian members, office staff members and representative for the student union as members.
- **Internal Complain Committee:** This committee has been constituted to redress complains from students, teaching and non-teaching staffs against any sort of sexual indulgence.

2. Counseling:

The college ensures various types of counseling services to help the students to attain their highest academic achievement and personal potentials.

- **Career Counseling and Placement Cell:** The college has constituted a strong counseling cell to assist the students to achieve and aware about various prospect and opportunities related to their higher studies and job opportunities.

- Mentor-Mentee group: Mentor-Mentee groups have been formed to support the students dividing them into small groups. The mentors upgrade the morale of the students and also monitor them twice in a week or whenever necessary. Motivational session also conducted frequently for their overall development.
- Parent-teacher meet (PTM): The PTM is organized in every year so that the parents teachers and students involves properly in the process of learning and teaching.

3. Common Room:

- The institution has a separate girls common room in the college. One lavatory attached with girls common room which is cleaned on a regular basis. An incinerator machine has been installed along with a sanitary napkin vendor are made available in the girls common room.
